


The Fight Against Privatization...

- * at the sale of beautiful, historic Doe Library, because UC-Berkeley needs cash, the library would make a great hotel, and nobody needs books now that everything's online?




No, wait! Doe Library isn't for sale. Not yet, anyway. But another building that is part of another venerable public institution is:

...Berkeley's beautiful, historic, downtown Post Office!

These dismaying developments are profoundly connected. Privatization is affecting us all, through our schools, universities, transit, parks, prisons, you name it, as well as through our Constitutionally established U.S. Post Office. Our Commons is being sold for private profit, union-busting and cash needed to pay off Wall Street bankers who created debt which is then claimed as the reason our Commons must be sold. Democracy is obliterated by plutocracy. Berkeley's City Council **unanimously** opposes the sale of our Post Office, but their position and alternatives are simply ignored.

In Berkeley we are fighting back!

We have been encamped in a valiant defense of our public building and the public service it provides since July 27, 2013. We have resolved not to leave by choice until USPS agrees not to sell the building.


